Welcome

When you think about 'rest', what comes to mind? What does it mean for you? Is it simply a break from the busy-ness of your regular activities, or something more? Is it something you do when you are tired, like going for a wee lie down on top of your bed, or the forty-winks you sneak in after a meal? Is 'rest' something you build into the way you live life, or is it found in the quiet moments as and when you can? And also, what constitutes 'rest' for you?

The ability to rest does not always come naturally to us, and I think the older we get the more we seem to need it – or is that just me? Experience tells us that we can no longer burn the candle at both ends the way we maybe once did. But then this implies that rest is related to sleeping and getting enough of it. I'm not sure this is the kind of rest God wants for us, and certainly isn't the kind of rest being encouraged in the Bible.

In the story of creation, God rested after his initial work was complete. We could project that without rest, his ongoing work of creation would not be possible, and whilst that is clearly nothing more than conjecture, it can certainly be said of and applied to ourselves. Without good rest, our energy, enthusiasm and ability become dangerously depleted. And so, breaking the ties that bind us to effort, responsibility, and the pressure of work is crucial. Even in retirement, we can be guilty of doing too much. Quality rest time is still needed though, even when our paid working days are done.

The holy rest God wants for us is about allowing individuals time and space to pause from daily life and work to connect with him. It is a distinctive biblical practice that emphasizes spiritual renewal and rejuvenation and is essential for the development of our relationship with God..

You may think that Sabbath observance requires a rigid set of practices, but in reality, it promotes freedom. Sabbath rest is about reconnecting with God and revitalising your spirit. Embracing this day does not mean adhering to a checklist; it means creating space for joy and renewal, making time for God. It's not just about taking a break from the everyday routine but about nurturing your spirit and reconnecting with what truly matters. Understanding holy rest is essential for spiritual renewal.

Modern sabbath observance can be achieved by setting a specific day or time when we disconnect from work and engage specifically in a time of worship, in prayer, in quiet reflection in the company of Jesus, perhaps through journalling, or walking, or while out in the garden or spending time with family. It is not the day that matters, it is the practice.

Jesus said, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls" (Matthew 11:28-29).

As you explore your own Sabbath practices, remember that it is a personal journey. So, take a moment to pause and experience the freedom and renewal that God's holy rest offers, and you will find peace.


